The Art of Spiritual Accompaniment 2024

We invite anyone of any denomination or none who has completed the <u>Spiritual Growth and Transformation</u> (SG&T) course to apply. The Art of Spiritual Accompaniment (ASA) builds on SG&T, including the experience of the listening groups. It is not academic.

We embrace equality and diversity and are working to make accompaniment accessible to everyone. We especially welcome applicants with disabilities and those from minority groups.

For everyone

ASA is particularly suitable for people who:

- find themselves drawn to listening to others' faith journeys
- wish to further develop their ability to listen to God in the lives of others
- sense a call to the ministry of spiritual accompaniment (spiritual direction)

Aims

ASA aims to:

- introduce spiritual accompaniment
- develop discerning listening
- enable growth in the ministry of spiritual accompaniment through prayer, listening and reflection.

Features

An ecumenical team has developed ASA over the last 20 or so years. It has five key features:

- 1. Prayer and reflection, experiencing approaches to prayer.
- 2. Observed listening in small groups. This develops into the practice of responding suitably, and with discernment, to what is shared.
- 3. Reflection in groups on the growth points experienced.

- 4. Explorations of the significant themes of Christian spirituality and spiritual accompaniment. These include (a) biblical and theological perspectives, (b) human development and (c) inter-personal dynamics within spiritual accompaniment.
- 5. Experience group supervision of your listening to a chosen individual from outside of ASA

Approach

The course:

- encourages openness to God, discerning listening to the Holy Spirit and a faithful response to the call of Christ in life.
- consists of an induction afternoon and twelve one-day sessions
- includes role play, reflection exercises, case studies and being observed in listening groups.

Requirements

The most important requirement is the desire for a deeper relationship with God, to grow in faith and develop the ability to accompany others on the spiritual journey. We expect you to:

- have completed SG&T
- have completed Basic and Foundation level Safeguarding through <u>Anglican online training</u> or denominational equivalent
- have seen your spiritual accompanier for at least a year
- provide a recommendation from each of your spiritual accompanier and church/community leader
- practise accompaniment with someone outside ASA
- commit to journaling and complete homework
- commit to attending all sessions (due to small group learning).
